\$323,097 dollars has been raised as of press time in the 1996 Friends of Scouting Campaign. This represents 86.2% of the council goal of raising \$375,000! Alligator District gets the bragging rites of being the first district to have reached its goal, hitting \$103.4% to date. Congratulations to Barry Collier and his entire team. The Foundation Division has reported 108.2% of goal to date.

Each district chair remains committed to reaching their district's goals according to current reports. based on projections, the council will set a record high achievement in F.O.S. setting the stage for initial implementation of the Council's Long Range Plan which includes this milestone.

- The school selected by the applicant must be an accredited public or proprietary institution or union apprentice program
 - · Academic record
- Recommendations from each of the following (no relatives): post Advisor, high school principal or academic adviser, and a community person
- Five hundred word essay about why the applicant feels he or she is qualified to receive the scholarship

Training News

The Council Training Committee has been working hard to develop a training calendar for the 1996-1997 Scout year that will meet the needs of all Scouters. As you can imagine, the physical size of our Council presents some interesting challenges. Throughout our calendar discussions, three issues were brought out time and time again:

1. We are one Council now, not two; 2. We need to get the training out where it is convenient for our Scouters to attend; 3. Our goal is to train as many as possible.

One of our challenges was to decide if we should have one Pow Wow or two. Our decision was the "one Council" rule applied here and we would have one Pow Wow. The location has not been determined yet. Should we stay in a central location, or go north one year and south the next? Would a school be a better location for this kind of course? Give us your thoughts. We want to hear from you.

Scoutmastership Fundamentals will see some changes. We will provide a Council course in the Fall and then District courses in the Spring. The Council Training Committee has set some specific guidelines for how a District SMF course will be presented. 1. The Course Director must be approved by the Council Training Committee. 2. The trainers must be "Train-the-Trainer" trained. 3. The course must have at least 10 participants registered two weeks prior to the course, otherwise the course will be canceled. (This is to ensure that there are enough participants to teach the "patrol method".) 4. The BSA syllabus contents must be taught - no short cuts. 5. It is recommended that 2 or 3 districts pool their resources and hold a joint district SMF course to ensure quantity and quality of training.

The Council Training Committee recognizes the importance of the Train-the-Trainer course. To assist new trainers in becoming certified in this area, an August 1996 course has been added to the existing calendar. Watch for more information this publication and at your District Roundtable. TTT will be scheduled twice a year from now on.

Outdoor Skills Instruction is a national BSA training program that this Council has not given enough attention to in the past. Watch for four OSI courses in the 1996-97 Scout calendar. The four OSI courses selected by the Committee are Camping, Cooking, Wilderness Survival, and Team Building. If you are interested in being the Course Director for one of these training events, we want to hear from you.

The Southwest Florida Council has just completed a very successful Wood Badge Course, SR-124. Congratulations

The big show Saturday night was a great success also. A big thanks to Gary Doney for that.


And a special thanks to "Red Dog" Maynard for putting together a great program.
