EAGLE SCOUT BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

As announced in the July-August Scouter, EAGLE SCOUTS will participate in the BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION during the summer of 1976, in Washington, D. C. The Southeast Region will provide four troops of EAGLES to support the efforts of the American Revolution Bicentennial Comm. in our Nation's Capital.

Each Council will submit one approved EAGLE SCOUT applicant and three approved $\overline{\text{EAGLE}}$ SCOUT Alternates to the Region for consideration.

All Eagle applicants must not have reached their 18th birthday prior to Aug. 30, 1976, must be an EAGLE SCOUT currently registered and active in troop or post, and must be a MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL EAGLE SCOUT ASSOC. on or before December 31,1975.

Completed applications (available at Council Office) with \$25.00-check(made out to the Boy Scouts of America) by Oct. 15, 1975.

The encampment date for the troop representing Fla. & Georgia is June 18-July 1, 1976.
