 - 11. Inform school teachers through county wide teachers meetings of the plan affording every boy a chance of becoming a Scout.
 - 12. Try to increase the number of boys becoming Scouts in rural areas by personal contact whenever possible.
 - 13. Report to Executive Board quarterly. This committee should meet at least four times each year.
